The Senior Infants have completed 4 weeks of a new English programme - Literacy Lift Off which aims to improve a child's reading, writing and comprehension skills through station teaching. It is proving to be a very effective and enjoyable programme for the children. Ms McCallion, Mrs Commons and Berni Finn have been working with the children in the Senior Infant classroom. It involves 5 stations: new reading, familiar reading, dictation, audio stories and an independent word work station. The children are tested before they start the programme and then again when it is completed to monitor their progress. School Self Evaluation

Our SSE curriculum focus this year is 'spoken Irish'. We identified this area of focus while engaging with the 'New Language Curriculum for Schools'. To date we have completed the following

- Collaborative and professional discussion, highlighting what is working well in the school and what we need to focus on. We discussed resources available and planning templates were distributed to all based on the advice given by facilitator Bríd Ní Dhonnacha
- Student Survey: A survey was completed by pupils in 2nd, 3rd & 4th classes to gain information, thoughts and opinions pertaining to the use of Oral Irish in school /at home.
- The Parental Survey draft has been completed and will be distributed straight after Easter.

Internet Safety Presentations a huge success!

Cyber Bullying and Internet Safety is an area of concern identified by the Parents Association. The school fully acknowledges that there is an increasing problem with social media activity outside of school impacting on pupil behaviour and relationships in school.

In an effort to make pupils, parents and staff more aware of the possible dangers as well as giving everyone advice on how to be safe on the internet Lurtel Ltd were invited to the school by the PA on March 20th. All pupils from 1st to 6th were given age appropriate information. This was followed by a presentation to the school staff at 3pm and later that evening a presentation to Parents/Guardians.

The informative presentations given by Trisha O'Sullivan clearly identified the various types of online activity available to users. Pupils were advised on the skills to stay safe. Parents and staff were advised on ways to monitor and protect children. Sincere thanks to the PA for organising the day.

Active Schools Report


The Active Committee met recently and discussed the following:
